

- Despite continued market softness in January, the Bank of Canada announcement that further interest rate hikes are likely on hold for the foreseeable future bodes well for the market

- · In addition, record population growth and tight labour market conditions will continue to support housing demand on a go forward basis


Average Resale Price

Message from Peter M. Gibson...

People are leaving Canada's biggest cities amid housing crunch

Canada's largest cities are getting bigger and more expensive, forcing hundreds of thousands of people to search for affordable housing elsewhere. Toronto saw nearly 100,000 people leave the area, with 78 per cent choosing to settle in other parts of the province over a one-year period to July 1st, according to recently released Statistics Canada data. Montreal and Vancouver saw about 35,000 and 14,000 people exit, respectively. International migration, however, more than offset these losses. The data showed most newcomers preferred large urban centres over rural areas. Canada's largest population centres gained more than 600,000 people from international migration, compared with just 21,000 settling in smaller communities. Toronto alone gained 216,600 people from immigration. Despite the exodus from some of the largest cities, many of Canada's more affordable large urban centres saw their population increase at the fastest annual pace since at least 2002 Peter M. Gibson

Should you add arched doorways to your home?



It's not your imagination: architectural arches are everywhere at the moment, and they look like they'll be sticking around. From windows to doorways and furniture to soft furnishings, interior designers have curves in all the right places. The question is, should you? Adding curved entryways and doorways in your home is no small undertaking, but with some thoughtful planning and consideration, they can be a fantastic addition. Here's what you should know before you go throwing curveballs.

Should I add an arch?

It might seem trendy now, but so were lava lamps once upon a time, and they're a whole lot easier to dispose of than an arched doorway. We're not here to rain on your parade — in fact, when done right, arches are elegant and inviting. However, think carefully and ensure you're doing it for the right reason. Will arches match your home architecturally? If your home is a new build, adding arches should be fairly simple, but additions to existing architecture that don't already have them may look out of place.

What kind should I add?

From gothic arches to semi-circles, there's a world to play with. Whether you opt for Mediterranean curves or Tudor-style arches, keep the radius consistent throughout your home so there's a nice sense of flow.

How many should I add?

Adding arches can open a can of worms, as it's unlikely you're going to want to add just one or two. Make sure there is consistency throughout and a sense of symmetry — nobody wants an arch that looks onto a square door frame. Instead of simply adding a random arch, incorporate them throughout your home.

Softer ways to follow the curve

Perhaps adding a curve to your home is just too daunting, and that's okay! While we feel romantic about them today, ten years from now, they could look awfully dated. Play it safe with mirrors, wall alcoves, bedframes, and furniture so you can stay ahead of the curve and go back to the straight and narrow whenever you feel like it.
